

Problems




- Need more quality submissions
 - It's a huge amount of work to write a Boost Library
 - Library documentation is not nearly good enough
- Need better reviews
 - Libraries are in the review queue for ages
 - It's hard to find review managers
 - Libraries don't get enough reviews
- Deployment
 - Boost is getting larger and harder to manage and deploy
 - Some libraries are left without a maintainer
 - Some libraries become obsolete and there is no way to deprecate them



Workflow







Supporting Library **Authors**



- Clear guidelines about what is required
- Library Submission
- Advice
- Simple tools
- Feedback on library development to motivate authors



- Comments and encouragement from users
- Test results from a variety of platform
- Reviews before during and after formal review
- Up to date statistics on library interest



Supporting Users



Central place to find all information about a library



- Central place to find all "extra" information
 - Tips and Tricks
 - Bugs
 - Known Gotchas
 - Documentation enhancements
 - Other users reviews, complaints and ratings
- Permit reviews outside of formal review period
- Permanent log of all of the above



Supporting Review Managers



- Delay review while the library has
 - no users
 - lots of complaints and/or bugs
 - no documentation
 - bad reviews
 - no reviews
- Make the review process easier
 - Should start with some number of reviews already done



Benefits



- More library submissions
 - better/simpler tools, modularized boost
 - comments, "pre-reviews", download statistics give authors incentive to "keep going"
 - testing dashboard and user comments help in development
 - author/user feedback loop draws users into the development process
- Improved review process
 - More good reviews by permitting "pre-reviews"
 - Feedback from users (or lack thereof) drives review queue priority
 - Easier review of library history



Deployment



Current Boost - Distributes a monolythic collection of libraries.

- "Top Down" driven by reviews
- Libraries tightly coupled
- "Carefully planned"
- One complete deployment managed by boost

Future Boost - looser collection libraries and certifies library quality

- "Bottom up" driven by user demand
- Libraries more loosly coupled
- "No planning whatsoever"
- Encourage special purpose deployments by third parties
